It Happened In the Quiet Room

I AM AN ALCOHOLIC. . . . In the past year I have repeated those words many times, and each time it gets a little easier. Yet I once hated the word "alcoholic" and would rather have died than allow myself to think I could possibly be one. Death was not far away when I was forced to make that very admission with all the humility that a dying alcoholic can muster up.

Many times since my entry into AA I've attempted to look back over my life and put my finger on one certain day, or month, or year, and say, "That is where I crossed the line, and became an alcoholic." With each attempt it was increasingly clearer that I became an "active" alcoholic at the age of fourteen, back in the summer of 1942, when a friend and I found an old keg of wine buried under a house, and drank it. The friend was deathly sick the next day. . . . I was under the house looking for more.

It's pretty clear to me now that I've been an alcoholic from the very beginning. I don't know why, nor do I care, but that very first

Steps One thru Three: Giving it up:

The cliché "Meeting makers make it' can be helpful-sort of. Group sharing, early on, helped me to solidify that I was really an alcoholic (Step One), and that a spiritual power, "greater than myself," could restore my sanity, consequently, I would never again have to wake up in another drunk tank (Step Two); also, those many meetings made clear that I needed to ask God for help, el pronto (Step Three). Yet I was told that "Survival on the fellowship was untreated alcoholism." I was also told that although meeting makers may make it to lots of meetings, and learn important and hopeful facts, it was not my solution. This process was only a beginningmany alkies who stopped at this point got drunk! Certain of the less sensitive refer to this as: "1-2-3 Cha-Cha-cha (not recom-





drink started me on a downward trip that continued over a span of fifteen years--until I had gone as far as an alcoholic can go, and live to tell about it.

In the beginning it was fun--the parties, the Navy, visiting foreign ports, earning a reputation as a money in my pocket and liquor under my belt I was a big shot and hoped everyone knew it. Many years and many heartaches later I came face-to-face with the person I really was. It took an awful lot of drinking, and an awful lot of suffering--and an awful lot of people were hurt along the way, including some very dear to me.

There were many reasons during my drinking years for me to try to stay sober and live a decent life-but none were strong enough. I managed to find a good wife, and we had two wonderful children. I loved them as deeply and sincerely as possible, but when it came to a choice between my family and the bottle, I chose the bottle. From then on life was an endless merrygo-round of drunkenness, jail, courts-martial, fights, debts, and all the usual calamities an alcoholic like myself manages to get himself involved in.

Drinking during the last several years was no longer fun. The constant sickness and suffering, which only an alcoholic can really know, could in no way be classed as even slightly amusing. The occasional hallucinations were frightening, but not frightening enough. .the attempts at suicide succeeded only in shaming me into more

drinking. . . and the realization that I was losing my sanity was not enough to stop me, or even slow me down. I was riding an Express Train to Hell on a one-way ticket, and I didn't know how to get off.

A little over a year ago this month I was in New York on leave. I had been drinking heavily for several weeks and was imagining all kinds hard drinker and quick fighter. With of crazy things. Everywhere I went I had the feeling that people were planning to kill me, or that they were devising all sorts of devilish tortures for me. I knew I had to sober up, but I didn't believe I could. I managed to get to a friend's house and was put to bed.

> Just about dark I heard voices outside the window, coaxing me to come out and join them. . .the window was fourteen stories above the street. Before I could follow the impulse to go through the window I went into convulsions, and then slipped into a deep coma.

> Though unconscious, I was completely aware of what was happening. I felt the sensation of sinking and at the same time I was getting colder than I can ever remember being. The lower I sank, the colder it got--and then a voice told me I was dying, and I was sure it was so. It was like being lowered slowly into a deep, black, icy cold pit, and the voice kept repeating that when I got to the bottom I would be dead.

> I had hoped for death to end my suffering countless times before. but when it was so close I was terrified, and wanted to live. Then the voice said there was something I knew that would stop my descent if

I would say it. I tried with all that was left in me, but couldn't think of what it could be. The voice grew louder and more insistent--and I continued to sink.

Then something made me scream, "I'm an alcoholic!", and I stopped sinking. Now the voice demanded something more, and down I went again. The voice hammered at me to say the one thing that would save me. I will never know why, because as far as I was concerned, there was no God, but I shouted, "God, help me!"

Again I stopped sinking, and my whole life was shown to me as vividly as if it had been on a movie screen, every single rotten detail, including many things I had long since forgotten. I was made to admit each separate wrongdoing, and to promise that I would make up for all the harm I had done. Then I was asked if I would be will- Navy travels, I have the wonderful ing to help other people, regardless of who or what they were, and only after promising that I would did I regain consciousness.

The next several days were a hellish nightmare of more convulsions and hallucinations, but I was safely tucked away in one of the "quiet rooms" of a Naval Hospital.

I won't try to explain what happened because there is no plausible explanation. It was only after several weeks, and after joining AA, that I realized I had had an experience which closely parallels the Twelve Steeps of AA. The Twelve Steps have come to mean very much to me. This past year (by the grace of God and with the

help of AA) has been the best of my life, with no exceptions.

I'm no better nor worse off, materially, than before, but in this new life I have started on I have come to know that many things are far more precious than riches, or success. I have a little self-respect now, and I no longer have to avert my eves when someone talks to me. I can smile and look squarely at anyone I meet. I no longer wake up with that gnawing sensation of fear, and I don't have to avoid people on the street for fear of meeting someone I've hurt, or stolen something from.

My list of amends to be made is a long one, but little by little it is getting smaller. I cannot hope to rebuild in a short time what I destroyed during fifteen years of drinking, but I'm deeply grateful that I have the opportunity to try. I'm grateful, too, for the knowledge that no matter where I go in my companionship of AA friends waiting for me, and I'm grateful for the knowledge that they are willing to share their strength, and hope, and experience with me, to combat any problems that may come up, no matter how big or small they may be. I am grateful that I have been given the opportunity to help others like me, who are still suffering from alcoholism as I once did. And. above all, I am grateful to God that He made possible the Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous, and that He saw fit to make me a part of it.

mended).

Steps Four Thru Six: Fessing it up:

My sponsor pointed out, just after we prayed the Third Step prayer together, that all my new-found spiritual gusto would soon fade away unless we begin Step Four at once (p. 64). After a short period of spontaneous God-inspired writing, followed by my own reflections. I then had enough honest information to allow my sponsor to take me through the Fourth Step Process. Step Five was done at first opportunity (p. 74), which started only a few minutes later. Now, being armed with those defects and shortcomings that constituted that bondage of self I confessed to myself that I had to become willing to have them removed (Step Six).

Steps Seven Thru Nine: Cleaning it up:

I then asked God to remove these suddenly revealed destructive facets in **Step Seven**, then reviewed and added to my mostly written **Step Eight** list. After a conference with my sponsor, and prayers to God, I began making my **Step Nine** amends as suggested in the Big Book.

Steps Ten thru Twelve: Living it up:

I have learned that the above nine steps were only a teaching-of-the-heart event. Steps Ten, Eleven and Twelve, are a lifelong process. Living these last three steps is a continuous re-doing (living) of the first nine! Life is easier, and much happier now—I have begun the process of living it up!
