
I will, not hurriedly snatch the nearest scraggly evergreen in the lot next to the North Street tavern, bigheartedly hand the attendant a \$10 bill

AA Under Water

A U.S. NAVY submarine, diesels pounding, glides swiftly toward its rendezvous. There are no hitches for the crew know their jobs well. The sub twists and turns, seeking shelter in the depths--spiralling first this way, then that. There are no explosions to smash lights and valves for this is peacetime . . . merely another training routine.

The engine rooms are silent now and the men reminisce over the last liberty port, make plans for the next. Others swap sea stories over coffee. In the radio room a ritual is being performed--strange for submarine life. The radioman pulls out a heavy wooden mallet from under a locker. He sets this on a narrow shelf. Next he lifts out a thick blue book and sets it alongside the mallet. Finally he posts a small sign on the door.

All is <u>ready</u> now and in a little while two crew members <u>enter</u>, each carrying a cup of coffee. One squats on the deck, for the cramped space doesn't allow more than two chairs. No greetings are necessary for these men live side by side in a hollow pipe some 300 feet long, day and night. One man bangs the mallet, says a few words and all three bow their heads for a moment of silent prayer.

The sign on the door reads: "AA Meeting Tonight." The mallet is the Chairman's gavel, and the blue book is a copy of *A lcoholics A nonymous*. This is the "Dolphin" group of AA, named after the emblem of the Submarine Service, meeting as all AA groups do to "solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism."

The members are the same as you would find in any AA group. One had been pronounced "hopeless" several years before by Navy doctors. He has been sober nineteen months. The second was on the verge of his first trip to the psycho ward. He has been sober four months. The third was well along the downward path that is alcoholism. He has been sober several weeks. All three, weak in themselves, know that in the group alone lies their strength, and they have gathered again to share it.

Long weeks at sea in a submarine can be trying to any man. Restlessness grows: nerves are on edge; well-intentioned words can lead to anger; the strongest of men can become irritated over a spilled cup of coffee or a stubbed toe. Were these feelings permitted to grow, they could be disastrous to an alcoholic trying to maintain his sobriety. But these three have their quiet meetings, twice weekly.

Each meeting helps to renew their emotional stability; each meeting strengthens the wall between past and present; and each meeting adds one more beam to the structure of once-shattered lives being rebuilt.

There is a Power greater than ourselves which makes this rebuilding possible and it is present, even beneath the sea.






