We're Not Perfect Yet, Bill Cautions

A gentle but earnest reminder that "we still have plenty of faults" and that A.A. will Continue to succeed only by adhering to the simple "principles of honesty, tolerance and humility" were the keynotes of Bill's talk at the 11th annual banquet in New York on Nov. 7, 1945.

Approximately 1,500 persons including hundreds of A.A.s from New York and out-of-town and their relatives and friends filled the Grand Ballroom of the Hotel Commodore for the affair which was sponsored this year by the New York Cosmopolitan Club. The non-A.A. guest speaker was the Rev. Father James P. Timmins of Manchester, Conn., who delivered a particularly dramatic and inspiring account of his personal observation of A.A. and its workers.

Besides Bill, other A.A. speakers were Connie M. and Bill F., with Greg M., serving as toastmaster following an introduction by Ed W., representing the Cosmopolitan Club.

Bill's talk coupled words of

The Second Step, The Heart of the AA Program

"Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity."

The most interesting characteristic of this Step is its effect on new persons in A.A. Some newcomers, perhaps most, already have accepted the doctrine that there is a Power greater than themselves. Others, more cynical, have difficulty believing that there is anything real unless it is another person or thing. "Some do and some don't; others will and others won't" as the old couplet goes.

And yet, the 2nd Step is the very heart of the A.A. Program. Without it, the most carefully planned approach to the problem of alcoholism fails; without it, the most stubborn and determined fall. Unless there is acceptance of a Power greater than ourselves, the other Steps become meaningless. They become

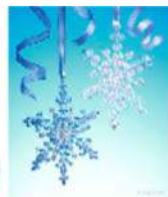

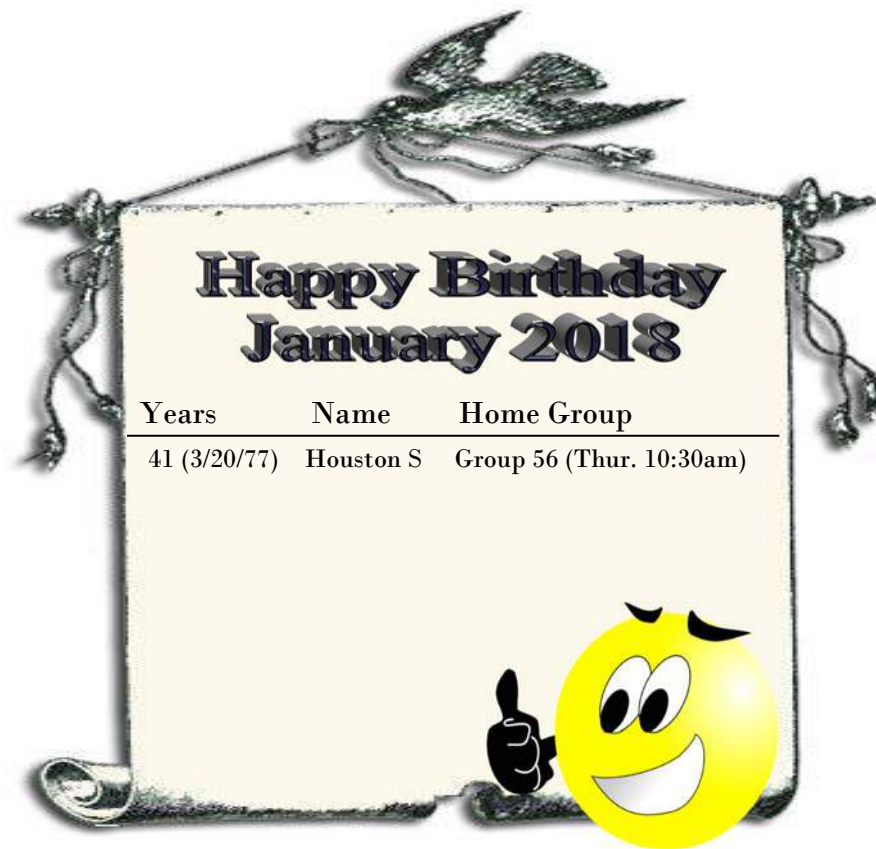

appreciation for the record to date with a plea that A.A., collectively and individually, hold steadfast to a singleness of purpose and not be diverted into the by-paths, of extraneous matters and issues.

"Let us remember the seeming paradox that the more we give, the more we shall have," he said. "Of course, with us it is not only a question of giving but also of giving up. I had to give up the belief that I alone could solve my problem: had to give up some false pride; had to make amends, and had to put someone's interests ahead of my own. Most of all, I had to give up the idea of my own omnipotence, to gain a basis for faith in my fellowmen and faith in Him who presides over all."

Turning to a "stock-taking" of A.A.'s success, Bill cautioned that when riding a "wave of success it is difficult to appraise. We are apt to forget the thin line between success and failure. The same principles that apply to individuals should apply to the group and to our relations to the outside world. As individuals, we have negatives, as well as positives, active or latent. We're still pretty intolerant sometime, and frequently we're exhibitionists. We still have plenty of faults and I think perhaps our public reputation as a group is better than we are."

Bill stressed anonymity as one thing that has helped A.A. tremendously. Another he called "sideline leadership," which he explained as the development of an A.A. who becomes a leader in the group, stays dry, helps others and then steps aside. "By renouncing human authority he can become a spiritual influence" in the group.

Bill recalled the fate of the Washingtonians of 1840 who, after mushrooming to a claimed membership of 100,000 disintegrated as an organization when they became embroiled in controversies resulting from a departure from their original objectives.

"They had no anonymity," he pointed out, "and Competition for personal leadership became common. They engaged in politics. Their newspaper editors began to quarrel with each other and the outside world. In short the Washingtonians went out to settle the world's affairs before they had learned to manage themselves. They had no capacity for minding their own business ... The negatives within them overthrew the positives."

"That won't happen here," Bill urged in closing, "if we remember, publicly and privately, our own simple principles of honesty, tolerance and humility, and that we live only by the Grace of God."

Father Timmins began the most stirring part of his talk with an account of a "bedraggled, excited drunk - Fred - who nearly three years ago introduced me to one of the greatest social movements of modern times; a movement whose implications have not even begun to be realized by the world at large." He recalled the evening that the man "came into my rectory - and poured into my ears such a tale of bewilderment, confusion and utter despair as I have never before heard and to which I hope never to listen again. That night I looked into the mind of a man in hell."

From there, Father Timmins traced the experience to an interview with Fred's family and then

-And Powerless Over Alcoholics, Too

IT CAME TO MY ATTENTION recently, that an anonymous alcoholic objected, strenuously, to non-alcoholics (Al-Anon's families and wives of alcoholics) using AA's twelve steps.

At first impulse, I wanted to drop the subject into a deep well, and leave it there, but then I heard it was quite an issue--so I am endeavoring to paint a picture of what we might be if we agreed with our anonymous friend:

1. Admitted we had power to "stop" our alcoholics from drinking!--that we were always able to manage our own lives without any help. The Lord knows I was never able to stop my alcoholic from drinking--one word from me and he did just as *he* pleased. He is now sober; is it my doing, am I keeping him on the ball, giving him that new lease on life that he has acquired? Do I have power to keep a twenty-four-hour check on the guy, preventing that first drink? If I have this power, then I should be able to pass it along to other wives and husbands, and we could be your guiding light. You wouldn't need AA. Now for part two of Step One. . . I was able to manage my own life--it was everyone else who was mismanaging. I "managed" it right into a hell of a mess. . . I hated me, and everyone around me. Brother, that's managing! I blamed the men my husband worked with, the distillers who made the stuff ("There oughta be a Law"), I blamed his Mom (poor Mom!)--but I am perfect, I can manage my own life!

2. Came to believe that I was sane. Everyone else was nuts, or my thinking was good. Being of sane

mind, I needed no greater Power. I was so sane that I threw fits, made scenes, grew hysterical over any provocation, went off the deep end without even being drunk from anything so tangible as alcohol. . . just my own emotions.

3. There is no reason to turn my will or life over to the care of anyone since I have done so well with the first two Steps.

4. Inventory: only the alcoholics need this step--haven't we already admitted how good we are?

5-10 inclusive: strictly for the alcoholics--we just proved this in the above Step.

11. Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God, as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of "Our will for them," and the power to carry it out.

12. Being of such saintly quality, we were never asleep at the switch, so we need no such spiritual awakening, so we will proceed to tell other non-alcoholics who are not yet aware that they are so wonderful, and practice these principles in all our affairs!

Now, having had a review of the above, would you like to head for the nearest deserted island, drop an H bomb on us, or just let us use the Twelve Steps as AA wrote them, and pray that they will help us grow. . . we are just mixed-up people too.

to a psychiatrist who steered them to A.A.

“Fred went ... to A.A. ... he had to fortify himself with a couple of drinks before venturing into this strange, unknown territory of an A.A. meeting. And here comes the marvel, the joyous unbelievable marvel ... those were the last two drinks that Fred, the hopeless, irreclaimable drunk, has had from that day to this (1945). I was confronted with the miracle of A.A....”

Fred followed the correct road of the A.A., a road that other addicts must travel sooner or later, if in A.A. they are to arrest the ravages of their obsession. He had acquired what I consider the basic virtue necessary for any man who wants to work the A.A. program successfully, the virtue of humility.

“It is neither an abject nor a crawling virtue. As the word itself, from the Latin *humus* (the earth), signifies, it is a down-to-earth, realistic view of one's self, not as the center of the universe and the lord of the world, but as a very small and insignificant unit in the vast sea of humanity. When one looks at the matter objectively and not through the veils of self-deceit with which the alcoholic addict beclouds reality, humility is an active, common sense admission of a hard fact that nobody can shape the world to his liking, nor even walk the ways of this world successfully in lonely independence. But the alcoholic, isolated by his terrible pride, must needs try it.”

The speaker frequently surprised the audience with the penetration and understanding of his analysis of the alcoholic.

“Who,” he said at one point,

“can depict that soul-searing loneliness of the alcoholic? He lives in the bosom of his family... but he is as remote from them as the inhabitant of another planet. They do not understand him nor he them. They look upon him as a heedless and irresponsible destroyer of their peace, a shirker of duty and a willful devotee of the dreadful vice of drunkenness... To them, it seems a simple matter of using his common sense and will power. But the alcoholic knows it is not. He knows that he is driven by some incomprehensible compulsion. So his sensitive soul shrinks into itself. He lies and evades and cheats to protect it from the painful wounds inflicted on it not only by his family, but also by his friends and his associates in the business and social world. Even in the midst of those who love him, he lives alone, with no remedy against the stark terrors of isolation save the old enemy, the anaesthetic, alcohol.”

In referring to the "religious element" in A.A., Father Timmins observed, “Seven of the 12 Steps in the A.A. way of life refer to God. All that I can say is that the Higher Power in those seven Steps - grows upon an alcoholic, even if he has little or no religion at all. In A.A., if the addict does his work well and sincerely, something happens. The self-god is toppled from its pedestal and in its place a new image begins to take form. It is the shape of a Power ... which ... becomes an ever-increasing reality in his life.”

men on a team that is without spirit; they become form without substance.

There are many things in our lives that we *cannot* change. Some of these things, or our inability to change them, may be the underlying causes of our alcoholism. They may be the things that we are trying to escape through alcohol. When we become sober and start out on the A.A. Program, these things remain with us. Of ourselves, we can do nothing about them. They are insurmountable. It is at this point in our lives that we draw strength from this Power that is greater than ourselves. Having turned these things over to it, they need no longer concern us. At long last they reveal themselves in their true perspective.

On the other hand, there are many things in our lives that we *can* change. Some of these things, or our failure to change them, may be the underlying causes of our alcoholism. Usually, we have lacked the courage to change these things. We have been unable to summon the courage. Immature and emotionally unstable, we have evaded reality by escape through alcohol.

When we accept the fact that there is a Power greater than ourselves, it is not too difficult to call on this Power for the courage

and wisdom necessary to face even a bleak reality. In other words, we have found an understanding and helpful friend who cannot fail us. We are relieved because we know that we are no longer alone.

Many newcomers to A.A. are troubled with what they call the "spiritual" part of the Program. They rebel at the thought that any part of A.A. is "religious"; that they must be "saved" in order to recover. This point of view is not only understandable but natural to a certain extent. The disease of alcoholism is a serious illness. Its victims have suffered. They have been either beaten or disillusioned and, if they have progressed far along the road of alcoholism, they have seen the failure of the purely "religious" approach. Indeed, they may have tried it-without success. They have become cynical and have retreated into themselves.

Let us give a word of hope to these cynical newcomers to the Program. Look around you. There are more than 40,000 persons in the world today who have recovered from this illness. Many of them, too, had trouble with the 2nd Step. Many, like you, were cynical. But they *continued to try to believe* and they *kept an open mind!* Today, they are well. If they remain on the Program, they will keep well.

Live and Let. . .

There are times now when my sons say, "Hey, Mom, the old Man is getting mellow!"

Part of it is gentle mockery; the rest an acknowledgment by them of what LIVE AND LET LIVE has changed in me--at least to a degree.

It wasn't always thus, and my wife and sons ought to know because there was no real peace in my home for quite a while after I joined AA.

Some people are born with a silver spoon in their mouths, but I came into this world with boxing gloves on my hands. I was taking the other fellow's inventory long before I ever took the first drink.

I spent a good part of the time silently or openly criticizing other members of the human race: their hypocrisy, greed, drive for power, exploitation of the underdog, false spirituality, etc.

And do you know, I never succeeded in changing one of them! But I became an increasingly bitter and poisonous individual.

LIVE AND LET LIVE eventually opened my eyes to the mental sickness which lies in intolerance. And it can progress almost as insidiously and destructively as alcoholism.

Where there is persistent intolerance, peace of mind is absent. A dry alcoholic who allows himself to be afflicted with hatred, malice, dislike, revenge or any censorious attitude towards another is literally depriving himself (or herself) of some of the beneficent wonders of AA and the blessings of harmonious living with others.

I like it when the family says I'm "mellow" It's a much nicer word than many others formerly applied to me. And what's more, I know they mean it.

Astonishing, isn't it, what can happen to a fellow in AA when he tries something like LIVE AND LET LIVE?
