Anonymity Is Vital From the Grapevine

Two important events lie ahead for Fort Worth Group No. One--the opening of the new clubhouse on West Fifth St. and the 1954 State AA Convention. Doubtless, AA will be much in the public eye of Fort Worth during the twelve-month period that lies ahead. Such being the case, we felt it well to touch upon a subject that perhaps is greatly neglected in AA meetings and coffee table discussions, the subject being none other than *anonymity*. One of our founders, Bill W., set down in writing some important thinking on this subject back in 1947 when the first booklet was published on AA traditions. Many new members will possibly be attracted to our fellowship because of publicity connected with the two events we have cited above. Let us, therefore, each take another look at what Bill had to say of this important AA tradition:

"Any who would drop their anonymity must reflect that they may set a precedent which could eventually destroy a valuable principle. We must

On Anonymity

THE anonymity of Alcoholics Anonymous is a relative term. You are not anonymous to your associates, to your family or to your fellows. You travel incognito if you choose and largely to the extent you choose. The press often times, at some expense to themselves, have been most courteous in honoring the spirit of anonymity whether or not they sensed at the time the value it held for those yet unrecovered, or could fully comprehend the role it played in recovery.

Intermittently and for what appeared at the time, good reason, individuals have laid aside its cloak and represented themselves as participants of Alcoholics Anonymous. But to the knowledge of this writer, none has ever betrayed the confidence of his conferees in either regard to anonymity or to the confessions that have been made to him in private. Each category is equally sacred and is held as privileged communications.

The disclosure of one's business affairs, state of health, social, political, or religious affiliations is reserved to that person's discretion, when he alone is involved. A doctor or priest may not divulge, and in most instances is estopped by law from divulging, even on the witness stand,

information received in the course of
carrying out his professional duties.

The anonymity in Alcoholics
Anonymous is a means of carrying out
the intent of privileged communications
imposed ethically and legally on physi-
cians and clergymen. It is at once your
strength and your bulwark. It should not
be lightly laid aside and never taken
from another without his authorization.
And finally if anonymity is sacrificed,
the perpetrator is ipso facto no longer
AA.

Conflicting opinions arise largely
out of a lack of precision in speech and
come to represent a contradiction in
terms. Devices assume the proportions
of principles which in turn are confused
with policies.

The principles of Alcoholics
Anonymous are contained in the title
and in the Twelve Steps plus the nega-
tive but important one of avoiding con-
troversy which generates resentments.

The policy of Alcoholics Anony-
mous is consistent with the principles.
Anonymity besides being a spiritual
principle is a policy in that it averts both
stigma and aggrandizement. Communal
poverty is a policy in that wealth is a
source of controversy. It is policy not to
participate in political or sectarian is-
sues for the same reason. To have a
minimum of organization avoids the
temptation of internal politics and con-
flict. The policy of attraction rather than
promotion is a buttress to the other poli-
cies as well as a source of spiritual
strength. Simplicity of the qualifications
for membership is a policy. The request
to the press to respect anonymity is a
policy. It is a policy for speakers and

writers to mention that the ideas ex-
pressed are their own and do not neces-
sarily reflect those of Alcoholics
Anonymous as a whole. It is a policy
not to conduct hospitals, retreats, re-
search, education, rehabilitation. It is a
policy to make this way of life available
to those who seek it.

For these purposes various devices
have arisen. The congregation of adher-
ents have formed groups and have em-
ployed persons to act as liaison between
the recovered and the unrecovered. In-
tergroup committees have arisen and
serve as clearing houses to abet hospi-
talization and public relations locally.
Sectional conferences have developed
for a wider discussion of common prob-
lems. The Works Publishing Company
was formed to print a book which
would help some not otherwise ap-
proachable.

The Alcoholic Foundation is a de-
vice by which individuals and groups
are related through an office maintained
for correspondence and which by its
ability to muster group pressure can
mentor transgressors and those who seek
personal profit or to use the good name
of Alcoholics Anonymous for purpose
not in keeping with its stated policy.
Since it is a medium implementing the
Twelfth Step on an international plane
and is supported by the groups or mem-
bers it must be responsive as well as
responsible. If it can only earn their
support, not alone financially but more
especially in consolidating sentiment,
by some form of participation on their
part then that participation must be wel-
comed. This is axiomatic and there are
two other coequal axioms. One is: that
the services of the central office must
be continued if many alcoholics are not

to die prematurely or to go insane (only a small fraction have been permitted the opportunity of Alcoholics Anonymous) and the other is: that any person or persons acting to bring the name of Alcoholics Anonymous into disrepute either by proselytizing, commercializing, by violation of anonymity or by any other means must be curbed or the effects will condemn many to insanity or death. Such a curb, if it is to be effectual and not create factions must be exercised with

the full confidence and cooperation of all. This confidence is now mediated through the founders. How is it to be perpetuated if not by some form of participation.

Yet another device is available and that is the Grapevine. It serves to reflect current thought and activities and can serve to keep principles and policies alive by reiteration.

never let any immediate advantage shake us in our determination to keep intact such a really vital tradition.

"Great modesty and humility are needed by every AA for his own permanent recovery. If these virtues are such vital needs to the individual, so must they be to AA as a whole. This principle of anonymity before the general public can, if we take it seriously enough, guarantee the Alcoholics Anonymous movement these sterling attributes forever. Our public relations policy should mainly rest upon the principle of attraction and seldom, if ever, upon promotion."

As Bill went on to point out, the general idea of anonymity encourages alcoholics and the families of alcoholics to approach us for help. We must keep their problems confidential, and if they see us wearing our AA membership on our sleeves, they most likely will turn from our doors. We must continually remember that an AA who has shed his anonymity and suffers a relapse may keep others away. Do as you will with your own anonymity--but remember, others may cherish it.

How I Lost My Personal Anonymity

SEVERAL years ago one of the clients of the ad agency I work for was sponsoring a weekly dramatic TV show--one of the top ten shows of that season. Part of my job was representing the client at sessions with the producer of the show; the client held me responsible for the quality of the dramatic fare he sponsored on the nation's screens.

One day I received from the producer a proposed script for a show which would star two glittering Hollywood personalities. The story was about a marital rift which caused the husband to drink alcoholically. When the rift was repaired, the husband returned to normal drinking, and the happy couple walked hand-in-hand into the setting sun.

Up to this point in my AA career, I had warily guarded my anonymity. I was now faced with a dilemma. Either level

with fellow workers, clients, and TV producer, or help let twenty million people be persuaded that alcoholism can be caused by personal problems--rather than vice versa.

After a rough debate with myself, I went over to see the client, told him I was a member of AA, and cited Chapter and Verse on what I believed to be the fallacy of the script.

He agreed that the script should be changed. I called the producer. The script was changed.

Here's where the selfish part of our program comes in. Of course I was relieved that millions of people would be spared a misleading treatment of alcoholism. But far more important than that to me, I found that by telling my associates that I was in AA, I had given myself the astonishing gift of freedom from furtiveness.

We don't hoard good news

I read Bill's plea "Let's Be Friendly with our Friends" so I am at a loss to understand the real anger and downright intolerance of some members of this Fellowship when a group of students ask permission to attend an open meeting to learn how we work--in order to write a term paper. Members audibly say, "We've got nothing for them. This thing is strictly for people who have an alcoholic problem. They've got no business here!" To refuse to attend, or support councils on alcoholism, amazes me.

Maybe I am extraordinarily thick headed but I somehow acquired the impression that we were banded together to help others who were suffering from this same disease, to find a way out and to help them back to being useful members of society. If that was the right impression then why deny anyone who is sincerely interested in this demoralizing illness, the right to learn? Why should we who want to help others be severely criticized for saying we would like to help our local county councils on alcoholism?

Personally I have had considerable experience in the field of medi-

cine and that field is only recently awakened to the possibility that a human being who uses alcohol to excess and extremes, habitually, is quite possibly a victim of an unbalanced metabolism, thus giving credence to the claim of those who suffer, that this is an actual illness.

It was through the sweat, and possibly even tears, of men like Doctor Bob and Bill W. that men and women who were shunned and verbally stoned were taken by the hand and helped back upon the road to a clean sober new life. It's a beautiful and wonderful thing to see and be a part of, but I am anxious to know why it would not be right for me to give of my experience to those who want to help.

It is my personal conviction that if I (as a civic-minded person interested in helping eradicate or lessen the terrible toll this allergy takes in lives, minds, broken homes, wasted lives, man hours that amount to a staggering figure each fiscal year--no pun intended) want to help the councils on alcoholism and feel that I have something to offer, it should be my personal right to do so, providing my anonymity and that of my fellow members is kept inviolate.

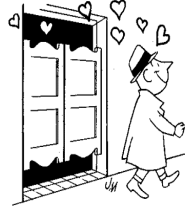
