and succumbed to their program of
action. The first tool for relief began
in Step Five. My sponsor, Carl, (He
just celebrated 50 years) burned up
most all my guilt-stained and tortured
paperwork . . . and as it flamed an-
nounced: “Bob, this is your past burn-
ing up in smoke. You don’t have to
feel guilty about all those awful things
you did because you are now on God’s
train and you are no longer doing
those things. You are becoming a
brand new person every morning you
wake up! But if you take just one
shot of whisky you get all your guilt
back (Thank God I haven’t!).

Another guilt removing tool was
found in Step Eleven (p. 86), where
we are to ask for “*God’s forgiveness*

*and inquire what corrective measures
should be taken.”* That’s the real an-
swer! God’s forgiveness!

After all, how foolish it is to ask self
to forgive itself. This is almost like
someone who has invented his own
imaginary god and then asks it for
directions. He will *always* get the
answer he wants: "Not guilty!" How-
ever, God is Truth (*The Great Reality
deep within p.- 55*). Only God can
truly forgive me. I now possess the
miracle of *emotional forgetfulness*; I
may remember the most horrid of past
experiences intellectually – and even
relate them to others – but that old
inconvenient dismal sinking feeling of
guilt no longer returns!

If we AAs offer such unlikely yet harmonious coloration, it is not surprising that we confound and confuse the "outside world" and even ourselves, with the almost ritual paradoxes which we must practice in all our affairs in order to perfect our sobriety and insure our growth. Pages could be written on the meaning and need of all of these strange contradictions which become neither strange nor contradictory to the developing AA member. To me, however, the most difficult and the most vital of all these twisters is one I've never heard verbalized, although the best AAs I know are living examples of its effectiveness.

"Hold lightly *and* tightly." I've often heard both of these actions urged separately but never realized until now how essential each is to the other. For I cannot hold myself "lightly"--that is, joyously--if I do not hold my AA "tightly." And I cannot hold my AA "tightly" unless I hold myself "lightly." The first without the second would make me a dangerously frivolous and superficial beacon, not only for myself but for those newer than I. And yet, the second without the first would make me a dangerously tense, heavy and certainly comic figure of "happy sobriety."

I well see a most delicate balance must be sought in the heart of this particular paradox, but one must first become aware of the "lack," as it were, before one can begin to correct it. Life seems to have been in a constant conspiracy to swing me wildly, drunk or sober, between tightness and lightness. It is no wonder, then, that serenity has appeared to me as an elusive shade cov-

eted by many and possessed by few. In my mind's eye I now review those few and find that each and every one has discovered this magic balance, this ability to take with joyous lightness the deadly serious challenge and destiny of their lives. I know of an AA who died laughing despite the most painful cancer known to man. His wife and his friends were healed and made proud and buoyant by his gaiety. He had learned to hold tightly and lightly, one to his faith and the other to his proper place. I have a long way to go before I find his talisman; yet, since it can and has been done, I have a goal toward which I can strive, once I begin to see a little of what it needs.

Every AA group, as a dynamic whole and force, contains the answers and the usage of all of these paradoxes. "Easy Does It," "Live and Let Live," "First Things First." The group acts out and lives by these real and practical truths. If it didn't, there would be no reservoir of experience and knowledge on which we struggling ones could draw. I've seen this over and over again in group behavior. It is called the Group Conscience, although I wonder if Group Consciousness wouldn't be more apt. A healthy group has this key to balance and thrives accordingly. Why, then, do I as a member so quickly shed this wisdom when I leave its blessed climate? I can only suppose it is because I fail to carry into all of my affairs--as a daily, aware discipline--the group's revealing lessons.

I blush to think how often I have gone from the purifying laughter and tears of a group completely in sympathy with a speaker telling his story, to a business meeting of the selfsame group dis-

solved into dissension and bitterness by the immediately resurrected tightness of some and lightness of others, more easily identified as ego dominance and irresponsibility.

I hear myself taking responsibility from those who must also learn to use it, for the shortsighted excuse of group efficiency. I hear myself oppose and expound, judge and pronounce all for the "good of the group"--without thought of the *growth* of the group, without remembering the laughter and tears that the growth of one individual had brought me but a moment before. Where is my "lightness" and "tightness" now? I have left it behind at the open-meeting door, where I have so often left love and compas-

sion, understanding, justice and truth. I have left it with my group, the very best part of me.

Well, now that I think I understand my new and self-made paradox, I'll soon find out how hard it is to work it. But I have at least been around long enough to know that each new insight brings a measure of progress and I have also been around long enough to know that progress, even a little, is all I can expect. I will never "be a saint by Sunday," as someone once told me I was trying to be, when I was on a "I must love everyone" kick. But I can continue to try.
