I Cringe!

I continue to observe a disturbing and continual demise of years-held AA meeting customs in my current AA community. These practices have served not only to solidify our unity but have kept our gatherings informative and pleasurable. I cringe as I watch them disappear. I have listed a few of these:

When we do the readings the reader’s name is often not used; instead it goes like: *“I have asked a friend to read . . .”* How impersonal is that? How lazy is that? Are we just friendly strangers?



I believe the regular meeting readings are important—especially for the new person. However, some meetings go on and on with many-many readings. This over-reading ***destroys the sharp point*** of the steps and Traditions—besides, how boring!

During the vitally important reading of our Twelve Steps some audience members mock the process by “calling out” supposedly humorous statements—sometimes at every meeting! To the newcomer the Steps are life and death—it is not joke for them! For most seasoned AAs this is an ongoing bore.

GOD AS WE UNDERSTOOD HIM

Very few of today’s two-million-plus AA members claim to possess a satisfying scientific definition of God. However, there exists undeniable evidence that God’s power has released countless of its members from alcoholic obsession.

Steps Three and Eleven contain the phrase, ***“God, as we understood Him.”*** When I was new, I found this insert both challenging and confusing; consequently, I soon found myself delving into books on theology, theosophy, Philosophy, and other mystical readings—but to no avail. I soon realized that I was no further along understanding God than when I started. Months of studying left me without any satisfying logical or scientific definition—what to do? After all, am I not supposed to ***“understand God?”*** If not, perhaps my sobriety would be in jeopardy! Confusing times!

But then, I came across a *watershed idea* from Bill W’s Oxford mentor, Reverend Sam Shoemaker who wrote: ***“Step Two is not theological; it is evidential.”*** Of course, I could plainly see the evi-

Kenn said, "I didn't know what to say to him so I just told him what happened to me."

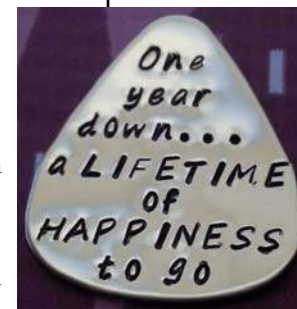
They went to five meetings in four days and Kenn got on his pink-cloud and flew back here to San Juan!

FIRST MILEPOST**

"RARELY have we seen a person fail who. . . . If you have decided you want what we have and are willing. . . . Remember that we deal with alcohol, cunning, baffling, powerful. . . . We asked His protection. . . . Here are twelve suggested steps. . . ."

Doesn't that sound familiar? Those are some of my reflections of a year ago. I had an awful lot of doubts but today I've made a year without the first one. I may as well admit I'm a bit proud but also I am very grateful. It seems like a very brief long time since I called for help and my sponsor-to-be came. To say it changed my life is a great understatement.



My inventory shows that there are many things to be worked on. I have not made amends in all cases and I wonder if I am really entirely ready to have all defects removed. I don't know if my progress toward a spiritual awakening is adequate, but I am certain I would not invest one penny in my old self and I'd really plunge on the new one--I think he finally has his feet planted on solid ground and the road ahead looks smoother and wider.

So now that we have one year, we will go for two. . . *but* always on the basis of twenty-four hours at a time!

BEYOND STEP ONE

IT HAS BEEN MY CONTENTION for some time that AA is *not* merely a fellowship of ex-drunks gathered together for the purpose of staying sober. It is a program for better living, in which the gaining and maintaining of sobriety is merely the first step--to alcoholics a "must" and all-important one.

The AA program centers on better living rather than sobriety. In the Twelve Steps the words alcohol and alcoholics are each mentioned only once. I think it is logical to assume that they are used in Steps One and Twelve simply because we are a Fellowship of alcoholics and sobriety is our first problem, not our last; nor can they all be solved by sobriety alone.

The other ten Steps do not refer to drinking but dwell on improving our way of living. I will concede that these other ten Steps would help a person stay sober if he saw fit to use them for that purpose and they are no doubt an *indirect* asset to sobriety; but they are a *direct* benefit to a better way of life.

The "Definition of AA," as many have seen fit to call it, is for me a complete explanation of AA.

The last sentence in the so-called "Definition" says: "Our primary purpose is to stay sober and help other alcoholics to achieve sobriety." It does not say "Our purpose"--it says "Our *primary* purpose." In other words, not the whole purpose but the first.

First of what? My answer is--the first of a *series* of things we must do



if we want a better way of life.

Instead of attendees announcing as an alcoholic, many find it necessary to tell they are an alcoholic-and-a-something else. Well, who isn't! This practice dilutes our primary message of how we found a release from *alcoholic* obsession.

Non-alcoholics should not speak at open AA meetings. Non-alcoholics may speak of their rights yet fail to acknowledge that not being members of AA they have no rights. AA is for alcoholics—period!

I believe sobriety tokens are helpful, especially for members going through their first year. However, some groups present said reminders each month. It is easy to see how this ruins the process. It soon becomes old-hat. Oh hum.

Lastly, I cringe at the silly “Chicken Dance” at meetings end. This destroys the prayer’s sincerity.

Do you also cringe? I hope so.

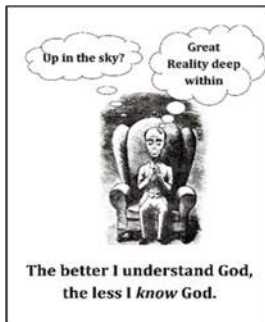
dence of God’s work by simply observing numerous members around AA tables with many years sobriety; they all claimed that contact with God, or a “Higher Power,” was keeping them sober. It was evidential! I had been barking up the wrong tree! I no longer need search for a logical definition of God, but I still needed to improve my conscious contact with God. Step Eleven convinced me that I could begin to **know** God through prayer and meditation—then there would be no need of a logical or scientific

understanding of Him.

I have come to believe that I need to contact (**know**) God from my deep innermost self (heart) and not from my ever-inquiring alcoholic mind. I had been searching for God from the wrong place all along! After all, doesn't the Big Book speak of the “*Great Reality deep within?*” (p. 55). So, in conclusion, I restate the cartoon above: “*The better I understand God, the less I know God.*”
