ONCE a few years ago I tried, with meagre success, to sell hearing aids. It was only one of many dreams of becoming a hot-shot salesman and getting rich, and it resulted like so many of those dreams in time and gasoline lost, but I learned some things that may interest you.

Hard-of-hearing people-never, never say "deaf"--some people think are a queer lot. Their affliction almost always grows on them imperceptibly so that they are the last ones to notice it. They insist other people do not speak loud or distinctly enough and the habit of not listening grows until they miss more and more of life; and oral intercourse, unless they are dominating the conversation, becomes a rarity; consequently the inevita-

March 17th celebrates St. Patrick's Day. He, so the legend goes, chased the snakes out of Ireland. But great as was his achievement, AA goes him one better--and covers a lot more territory in the process. It chases the snakes out of the lives of many alcoholics in the United States, Australia, Sweden and in every other country where there is an AA group--even in the self-same Ireland!

Speaking for myself, snakes never bothered me. It was those alcoholic leprechauns--those little 'green men' (not Irishmen) who used to stand outside my door and dare me to come out and fight. D.T.'s, you know! Sure and it wasn't a great day for me to hear those little 'green men' taunting me between hiccoughs (theirs and mine.) But eventually the great day did come! Call it the luck of an Irishman (once removed)--but AA and I found each other.

When I say I found AA, I mean just that. I pounced on the Program as if I had made a great discovery.

I drank in the words of the members (my first constructive 'drinking,' I might add.) I looked upon each speaker as if he were a football coach saying: 'Come on boys, get in there and fight!' And fight I did. I fought hard against taking the first drink. Pugnacious was the word for me. And I noticed something. I noticed that the Reardons, O'Briens and Murphys--and many of the other Irish who joined AA--gave that first drink one whale of a fight, and generally won out.

Being of Irish descent and belliger-

ent by extraction, I am proud of the success of the Irish with this Program--and their increasing numbers. Once they accept AA, they are forthright and unequivocal, honest and declarative in how it works for them.

That's the Irish way of doing things. If they have an opinion, they express it unmistakably. If they believe in God, they call him God and don't temporize with vague references to a Higher Power.

It's so characteristic of them. When an Irishman gets drunk, he doesn't hide timidly at home behind the curtains or Venetian blinds, or remain speechless at a bar. Brother, he's drunk--and what of it! His behavior is uninhibited and his positive opinions on life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness are outspoken. Naturally, he's the same person in AA. . .only sober!

There are so many Irish in this organization, it reminds me of an old wisecrack (and here's where a shillelagh bounces off my head again): "You don't have to be Irish to join AA--but it helps!"

ble withdrawal leaving them lonesome and friendless. Strangely enough it never occurs to the victims that the failing is theirs or that they can do anything about it. It is generally some relative or relatives who become desperate and who persuade them to contemplate a hearing aid, and almost never will they try one when the idea is first suggested or buy one on the first demonstration of the instrument.

Every hard-of-hearing person has a different pattern--each one has certain frequencies that he can hear fairly well and others that come in weaker. Some have nerve defects All have certain conditions in which they do fairly well and others under which they fail sadly. Each has a different percentage of hearing left when first approached.

Once your sufferer has decided to try a hearing aid the trouble is just beginning. Noises which we commonly ignore, but which he hasn't heard for a long time, suddenly impinge on him and make him so nervous he can only stand the instrument for a short time each day at first. He has generally lost what is called a lot of his "sound vocabuhe is familiar when written have lost charged, kids. their meaning to him when heard.

There is a lot of bother to adjusting and wearing the instrument, and guite an effort to be made focusing his attention on what he hears after so long a time of inattention. Sponsorship Is a **Two-way Street**

I was exceptionally skeptical the first time I heard someone say, "Sponsorship helps the sponsor at least as much as it helps the newcomer." I thought that sounded too much like what my father would say when he was giving me a whipping: "This hurts me more than it hurts you." Sure, sure.

As far as I could tell, sponsorship was yet another form of authority. I liked it and hated it that way. I wanted a sponsor to give me all the "right" answers to my problems and the problems of the world, but I would buck against him whenever he gave me unsolicited or undesired advice.

That thinking pretty much determined the kind of sponsor I became during my second year. I was an authoritarian sponsor in spite of the fact that during my eighth or ninth month I met a guy whose words, actions, and manner consistently demonstrated a sponsorship style which transcended the authority/ subservient presumption. That man is my sponsor today. But I learned how to be a sponsor like he is from my sponsees at least as much as I learned from him.

I worked with some newcomers during my second year. I tried to use fear, guilt, and a drill sergeant's voice to motivate them. I gave each one reading assignments from Conference-approved literature, writing assignments, and lots and lots of lectures. I would never share from my own experience, weakness, and despair because that might tarnish

my authority in their eyes.

But I did welcome one really struggling newcomer to my apartment for two days. He wanted to stay longer but I insisted that he find his own place; this turned out to be good for us both. I insisted that another call me each day from rehab. That kept the memory so green for me. Meanwhile, giving all those reading assignments kept me really busy. I had to reread all the literature I had assigned so that I could answer any sponsees' questions "perfectly" like a true authority. That's how being a sponsor began to help me.

Two of the guys fired me. Boy, what a blow to my ego. I hoped that they would find other sponsors but was secretly glad to be free of them. At least, that's what I said. One dropped me, I think, because I never opened up to him. He said I never admitted to him that I "made mistakes, too." The other told me that I was constantly criticizing him without complimenting his small steps in the right direction.

Boy, were they both right! But I didn't drink over being wrong and those two guys are still sober. So, by the grace of God, is the one who didn't fire me. It was a tough competition between God and me to see which of us was the true sponsor for these guys, but it was never close. The God of our understanding got each one of us through.

Sponsoring began to work for me



later. I prayed to God to let me give more service during my third year. I knew I needed that in order to maintain my sobriety. At that time, I no longer had any sponsees. Within hours of praying for a chance to serve. God presented me with an interim sponsee. We hit it off immediately. Listening had become a lot easier for me. I tried new ways of making firm suggestions. After all, this would be a learning experience for me, too. More frequently than not, I considered the fragile feelings of my sponsee before biting off his head. I tried to toss out possibilities and suggestions without the tone of

someone laying down the law. But when I knew in my gut that he needed to hear a blunt message, I gave it to him straight. Finally, and most importantly, I think, I began to share with him what I had previously only shared with my sponsor: what was going on with me. I became vulnerable. And I didn't pick up a drink, a day at a time.

I have learned many lessons from my current sponsee and from the former ones who are still in touch with me from time to time. Try sponsorship. It works.




