EVER SINCE I attended the annual Thanksgiving meeting in Jonesboro, Arkansas, last year, I have been wanting somebody-preferably *not* me--to write and let all Grapevine readers know of the "Birthday Plan" presented to us at that meeting by "Ab A." of Oklahoma. My wishful thinking does not seem to have been productive, so I feel I can procrastinate no longer.

The "Birthday Plan" is quite easily understood and, in my opinion, a most feasible method of increasing group contributions to General Service Headquarters. The idea is that as each member of the group celebrates another AA anniversary, he or she give to the group's General Service Headquarters fund \$1.00 for each one year period that person has been living--or is attempting to live--the

Fringe Benefits

No, I'm not a union representative, and I'm not here to press my brotherhood's demands for more paid holidays, longer vacations, more sick leave, or longer coffee breaks. I'm just another informed (not reformed) alcoholic, who in addition to being grateful for my sobriety, must express my humblest gratitude for the *fringe benefits* I have so recently received from this fellowship.

Yes, I know, some of the hardshelled old timers are going to rise up screaming, "You came here for sobriety only; that's all we guarantee and that's all you'll get."

But they also told me in order to gain this thing of joy called sobriety, I must practice the Twelve Suggested Steps of AA. And if I do this, to the best of my ability one day at a time, then I am already enjoying an extra benefit beyond the promised sobriety: the will, wisdom and knowledge of a God as I understand himsomething I did not have prior to AA. I gain faith, a second unpromised benefit, when I admit that the ability of this higher power to manage my life for me is far

SEEDS OF SOBRIETY VIA STEP TEN

"Every moment of every day, God spreads winged seeds of sobriety over the desperate souls of every alcoholic when they ask for help. However, seeds that come to rest in soil of selfishness, dishonesty, resentment and fear fail to germinate and are lost. Fortunately, Step Ten teaches us how to maintain the sort of fertile spiritual soil into which God's seeds will cultivate joyous and continual sobriety.

The Step Ten directions (p. 84) tells us to continually watch for those new mistakes men-

tioned above—this sometimes needs happen before exiting bed in the morning. If one of those "grosser handicaps" are taking space in my noodle, then a prayer is in order. It is time to reflect on

the Big Book directions how to face and be rid of selfishness, dishonesty, resentment and fear.

As I go through the day, I need to be aware of and utilize the important "face and be rid of" tools found in Steps Four Through Nine. When a new or old resentment crops up I need to remember the five-part spiritual Prayer on page 67 and considering whether I was at fault. When stupid and irrational fears crop up I need remember the fear prayer

on page 68. When I feel myself veering toward selfishness and/ or dishonesty I need to remember as how this is often my dismal nature. What to do? Where is my Big Book? After all, I must keep in a fit spiritual condition if seeds of sobriety are to bloom into a joyous and God Filled day.

My Big Book tells me that when selfishness, dishonesty, resentment and fear crop, I am to ask God at once to remove them. Then I need to discuss them with someone immediately. If I have harmed someone, I am to make amends quickly. Who said there was no timetable in the Big

Book? However, after all, God gave us brains to use, so you probably shouldn't wake up your sponsor at three in the morning for some trivial and unnecessary reason.

If I continue to cultivate my spiritual ground of being, Step Ten promises that my sanity will grow to where I will be able to see and act on the truth in the matter of drink. It even informs me that my mental obsession will be removed! (p. 85) But the prerequisite is that I maintain a fit spiritual condition. I must continue to thank God for continually planting His seeds of sobriety in me throughout each day for the rest of my life.



AA way of life. Specifically, I contacted Alcoholics Anonymous in May 1953; so, in May 1956 I will give willingly, thankfully, and most gratefully to the treasurer of our group three dollars (\$3.00) as a token birthday present to AA.

We like to think of this contribution as a "gratitude gift" and have elected to consider as the anniversary date and starting point, as it were, the approximate date one first contacted AA. It has been suggested that maximum birthday contribution would not equal the suggested be set at ten dollars (\$10.00). This, of course, is not an arbitrary figure and. I think, was mentioned so that menting group funds sent to Genthose who are so quickly overcome with the ague, "screamin' meemies" or what-have-you at the mere men- note: In the Milwaukee area, you tion of finances would not close their minds completely and burst forth with the habitually convenient excuse, "no fees, no dues." From a purely financial and material standpoint, it occurs to me that ten dollars is a very small gratuity for ten years of renewed faith, happiness, tranquility, and real friends to help us--particularly when we are indulging in one of our constantly recurring depressed sprees.

We have heard it often--I have said it too often--and I know it is horribly trite, but say it I must. How much more than ten dollars has each of us thrown away on just one drunk? What did we receive for our ten dollars then? Writing only for myself, I'll admit that there were times when the sought after oblivion was not attained. Now, after a short time we will continue to accept--and exin AA, I am able to reap untold--and pect--\$1.00 for each year one of perhaps unwarranted--benefits from every cent I put in the "kitty." I

am continually thankful that I still have left enough of my mental and physical capabilities to be allowed to add my contribution to this gift of gratitude.

As I understand it, contributions to the "Birthday Plan" originally were intended to be in lieu of the \$2.00 per year per member traditionally sent by each group to General Service Headquarters. The group of which I am a member, however, is a comparatively new one and, consequently, the annual contribution of the majority of the members \$2.00. We, therefore, adopted the "Birthday Plan" as a means of augeral Service Headquarters and not as one supplanting them. (Editor's can donate to the local central office. Perhaps the phrase, "the date one contacted AA," needs some explanation. We choose to use that wording because, unfortunately, there are some in the group who have not remained sober--dry, that is--for a continuous 365 days, but are genuinely grateful for those days of sobriety they have enjoyed. Those who have relapses and return also want to be a part of the continued growth of AA. They, it seems to me, are the criteria of gratitude and though they may not be grateful as constantly as those who have not had a relapse, certainly they are grateful oftener. So, our group has remained in contact with AA and will as the anniversary

This I think, is a good

suggestion, but I cannot write from experience as to how it works because our own little group is still too young to have inactive members.

better than mine. The benevolence of being humble falls upon me when I make (or become willing to make) amends, and realize that AA meekness does not mean weakness, but merely a different form of worldly power. And finally, from simply practicing these twelve principles of "the good life," I am benefited by being able to extend brotherly love and understanding to those who still suffer.

I am in complete understanding that these are all spiritual benefits, but you must grant that they go beyond that blessed state of sobriety.

But I began this little report to express my gratitude for certain material benefits I have received through application of our Twelfth Step. . .not as the one carrying the message, but as the recipient of the fellowship, strength, help and understanding that my area AA friends bestowed upon me.

Most American fathers, nearly every Sunday, load the wife and kids

into the family oil-burner, and start out for a little ride. A few Sundays back, I followed that time-honored custom by gathering five of my six together and placing them in the car.

Traffic in our neighborhood is normally light, and was this Sunday. I was driving in my usual careful manner, since I was sober. (It was only while drinking that I thought every thoroughfare was the Indianapolis Speedway and I was only one lap away from winning the "500.")

Only two short blocks from our home I entered a broad intersection after noting the approach of another car some 150 feet up the street. I was within six feet of clearing the intersection, when the other vehicle, travelling at an excessive rate of speed, smashed into my right rear fender. My car slid sideways, swerved back, flipped and rolled over three times. It ended up on the top, spinning around and around. Gasoline from the tank poured out over the street, the interior of the car and

saturated our clothing. But no fire.

None of the five children, ranging in age from one to nine years, was injured; I was not hurt; my wife suffered a badly lacerated hand and wrenched shoulder. The other driver, found at fault by the police, did not have a driver's license, insurance or a job.

As I crawled from the car and began getting the others out, how could I but know that there had been another, unseen passenger in my car during that short ride? Only the power of God had prevented that one spark which would have resulted in a terrible tragedy. Of this, I am positive.

We were all transported to the hospital by ambulance, for treatment and observation. I was badly shaken, but the desire for a drink or even the idea that one would calm me down didn't occur. The only thought I had (beyond the safety of my family) was that I wanted to get to a phone and call my AA friends. And this was without the desire for consolation or sympathy-merely for reassurance and those words of stability I knew I would receive.

As soon as I finished answering the hundreds of questions asked by the emergency desk, I got out my little address book and called the first name I came to. Just the sound of that calm, serene and sober voice took the tremor from my own, and in a matter of

minutes, peace flooded in. I was able to tell this person honestly that I didn't feel it necessary for him to come to the hospital. But I called a second friend, talked for a few moments, and told him I didn't really need his presence, just his voice. I had no sooner hung up, than he and his wife appeared. And they waited nearly five hours until all seven of us had been released by the doctors.

Upon arrival home, we found the house full of AA acquaintances, waiting to help in whatever manner needed. It seemed that we were in need of nothing urgent. but the word was out--"AA friend in distress." The phone rang continually, cars in and out of the drive, offers of autos, money, baby sitters, housekeepers, and companionship.

My only problem was someone to take over the operation of our home and children. I could get transportation for work from my employer, but the wife was unable to use either hand and had been instructed to rest. Three of the children are in grade school and one in high school. It looked as if I would have to lav off work. . .something I could ill afford.

Then began to flow those material benefits I spoke of earlier. The Al-Anon Family Group, of which my wife was a member, took over. Without my knowledge, they put into force the Twelfth Step in the form of fellowship and understanding.

wife of an AA appeared and took over the operation of my home. She got my breakfast and the children's: got me off to work: and under the supervision of my wife, took over the tremendous task of running our household.

At the end of five days, the doctors ordered my wife into the hospital due to complications from the tetanus shot and delayed shock after the accident. This shook me somewhat, also, . .but again, my power came to my rescue.

The Al-Anon group set up a daily schedule for the operation of my home. Each morning two women the Al-Anon secretary called to tell me who would be there the next day. They performed all the normal household duties: they washed, ironed, got the children off to school, fixed meals and did the cleaning. Others brought in food and treats for the children. My AA friends got me to meetings each night; they tried to find a suitable auto to replace my totally damaged one; they offered me the use of their own.

This assistance from the Al-Anons continued for the ten days my wife was in the hospital and for several days after she returned. I can have nothing but. the highest praise for these wonderful gals.

This entire experience brought so many things to light for me. . .not only of the tremendous power of

sobriety but, by comparison, the tremendous growth I had made in my own thinking.

Had this accident happened to me prior to AA, many things would have been inevitable besides a prolonged drunk. My thinking, naturally, would have sopped of self-pity and resentment. And my biggest resentment would have been against those people who, out of genuine interest and concern, would have called on us or telephoned to offer their help.

And so in ending this, I must once again express my deepest gratitude to AA as a whole; to my area in general; to my friends in particular; and to Al-Anon specifiappeared at 7 A.M. Each evening cally. For not only did they come to our aid in time of need, but they have helped my wife and family back to a more normal life and kept their growth at a pace even with my own.

> I know that I came to AA only for sobriety; I know I can expect nothing else; but I also know that He did not give me this way of life or the principles of AA without intending that I should find happiness and material rewards through the application of our Twelve Suggested Steps, Twelve Traditions and the twenty-four hour program. And I also know that to have sobriety without happiness and faith, is to know fear.
