A Mother and a Miracle

She was getting close to the end of the line when it happened. . .

"IT won't happen to me" were my words after attending a few AA meetings five years ago. I went there to prove to my husband that I was no alcoholic! It was because of him and his behavior that I drank. The more speakers I heard, the more convinced I became that my husband was the alcoholic. I could not identify myself with the women I heard. They had all been in institutions, jails, lost their husbands, children and so on. None of these things had happened to me. I was aware only that my marriage was a mess and that with five children to support, my husband was doing a poor job of it because he drank too much, too often.

After each meeting, I would go home and preach the principles of the program to my husband. The only answer I would get from him was, "Those people are a bunch of hypocrites, anyone can stop drinking with a little will power!" As I stayed sober

JUST as every business group of persons take periodical inventories, so do I, in reaching my six months of total alcoholic abstinence, thanks to God and the recuperation program suggested by AA, wish to make an analysis of the kindness received from our Creator during this time.

I consider that having been in the alcoholic path for eighteen years, with a total uncertainty for my real personality, drowning any reality and seeing my addiction to alcohol from an early age (which I can now understand was due to my predisposition to the alcoholism illness) little by little, without being able to tell how it really happened, I become a slave of alcohol. Here are some of the steps I descended:

Several times I woke up at police posts as a result of my drunken condition, with no recollection of how I got there. Most of these times I went back directly to the "bottle" saying that I needed to "undrunken" myself.

I lost some very good jobs in my specialization. As I wasted fruit from my work in the bars, I would tell my "ego" that it would be difficult for

and continued to go to meetings, it
seemed that my husband's drinking
became worse and the problems in our
marriage became more severe. So at
the end of a few months, I decided one
night, New Year's Eve, to take a drink.
What was the sense of my abstaining,
my husband wasn't going to change, so
why should I? One drink led to two,
two to three--the usual pattern, and in
the wee hours of the morning, I found
myself in an automobile accident
which completely demolished my car.
Fortunately, I was not seriously in-
jured. I don't remember much about the
next few days. I do know I wasn't able
to stop drinking and my home became
a skid row. Within two weeks, I had
my first introduction to an institution.
Two policemen took me out of my
home and I spent the night in jail. In
the morning, I was committed for two
weeks' observation. I was told by the
doctors there that I was an alcoholic
and that I could not drink.

Upon coming out I found that I had lost
the part time job that was of great im-
portance to me. The next few months
are vague in my mind, but I do know I
continued to drink and it got worse. I
was pregnant at the time and my hus-
band had taken off. I had a few more
trips to the institution and then one day
I lost the baby I was carrying. I blamed
all my behavior on my husband. He
was irresponsible, unfaithful and a
drunk.

I then tried to assume my responsibili-
ties for the children's sake and found I
couldn't stop drinking. Finally, my five
children were removed from me. When
the children were gone, the heart fell
right out of me. I knew I had to stop

drinking somehow, but I couldn't. I
went from job to job and lost them in a
short time because by now I was drink-
ing all the time and sneaking it, think-
ing no one knew. I paid a few more
visits to institutions. I was up to my
neck in self pity. My husband had be-
come a philanderer and I didn't know
where he was or what he was doing.
My heart ached for the children.

About six months more elapsed when
the news came that my husband was
dead. He had put a rifle to his mouth
and blown his head to bits. After this
tragedy my drinking became worse. I
was now full of self pity and rational-
ized my drinking by, "What have I got
to live for now?" It wasn't long before I
was back in the institution. This time I
was told not only that I was alcoholic,
but that if I drank again I would have
severe brain damage. I had two convul-
sions on this tour. This didn't frighten
me too much--they say you can't scare
an alcoholic.

When I got out this time, I didn't drink
for three months, but I was on pills and
barbiturates. I had heard that these
would lead you back to drinking. The
day came when I started to drink again,
and the tours of the hospitals, jails and
bars was my life. When I wasn't in jail
or the institutions I was in a bar on the
merry-go-round, twenty-four hours of
the day. I had no cares and the sooner I
died, the better. I couldn't think of a
soul that would miss me.

It was only by the Grace of God and
AA that I am well and able to tell my
story today. At the end of my last
drinking session I ended up in bad
shape physically as well as mentally.
AA was called and shortly after I was

my employers to find a person like me for that job.

I dragged many people outside and inside my family through the tragic consequences produced by alcohol, without being able to measure until what point I hurt those people during my conscious and unconscious times.

I got to feel the "bottle" as my only and loyal companion. I wasn't able to have mine or another person's money in my pockets because immediately my thinking would go to drinking.

I made of lying, a caprice of my "ego," using it to justify my drunkenness and irresponsibility, up to such a point that I believed my lies myself.

On several occasions, and due to my work, I went to other cities trying to cure my alcoholic illness and what I called, at that time, my terrible sufferings. But in a short time I would come to the conclusion that the real and only purpose for going away was to get away from my family so I wouldn't have near me anybody who could reproach my acts. The sickness, as a loyal companion, would go with me anywhere. During my last drinking periods I even thought of committing suicide. I thought at that time the Divine Providence to which I had reverted on several occasions for help was also against me.

Up to here the balance more inclined to the negative part of my existence. It was a figure read in mathematics as "less than zero." Then came the awakening, from a long and terrible lethargy, the path towards Alcoholics Anonymous. There I found "something" that I was wishing to find for a long time and which I never thought I could get. With the will of God, the understanding and

help from my companions I began to find myself. The miracle had taken place. The alcoholic compulsion disappeared by enchantment. Trying to follow as I best can the Twelve Steps suggested by AA, the balance is already coming to the positive side. Today, although a short time has gone by, the balance is like this:

I have come to the belief that there is a Superior Power and so my "ego" has started to deflate; there are still some times when it tries to revolt, but fortunately I already have the tools with which to oppose it. I am trying to be understandable with my beings. In this I have made some progress. I have learned to be sincere with myself and in this way with those around me. As a consequence of all this, my biggest character defects are beginning to give up and some have been extinguished. I ask God every day to free me completely from them. In having confessed to God, other persons and myself the exact nature of my faults, I have unloaded a little the weight of one of the negative "bundles" in the balance. Praying and meditating I try to better my contact with God, and in His infinite kindness I ask to be a tool of His will.

I have learned to organize daily the execution of all my acts, directing them under a moral discipline. I try to accomplish, without postponing, the programs I plan each day in waking up and, when at night, before going to sleep, I review my activities during the day, I have real pleasure in seeing how wonderful life is when you make good use of time. Helping a fellow being is something that re-comforts my emotional sobriety. Having learned to ask help of my Creator, all my pessimism has changed to optimism.

The satisfactory experiences I have been able to have during this short time of my spiritual and material awakening, have been many, and every day that passes I feel life more pleasant and worth living. My relatives are again without the fear I had them with. With the confidence that I am getting every day, I can see that my employers see another collaborator. I try to make them my friends and not my enemies. I have left from my vocabulary the word "impossible." I really enjoy the meetings with my new companions and many old friends from our revels. I enjoy the beauty of nature and I make of my business trips something to recreate my spirit, and the results are

really good.

Thanks and thanks a million, companions, for having helped me to see and live the life as a normal human being, trying to be useful to my country, to society and my family. For Alcoholics Anonymous, although I haven't mentioned it in the active of my balance, God knows that He and AA have been the cornerstone that started the stabilization of the balance and its results. The Twelve Suggestions have come to be a part of life's code and every day I say, "God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, courage to change the things I can, and wisdom to see the difference."

back in the institution for medical treatment. I snapped out of it physically, but mentally the DTs left me in another world. Then one day I slowly came out of this world and back to reality. AA surrounded me in the hospital and grabbed me when I came out. I am very grateful to my sponsor today, for if it hadn't been for her, I believe when I left the institution I would have run right back to the only friend I knew--the bottle!

Down deep in my heart, I believe eventually my children will be with me to share this with me. That too will be when God thinks I'm ready.

The *fear* that brought me into AA no longer exists. In its place I have slowly gained a wonderful *faith*--in God and AA. If you have ever used the words "It won't happen to me" take it from one who learned the hard way--if you are an alcoholic it will happen, if you keep drinking and you *live* long enough!

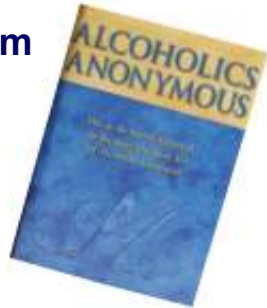

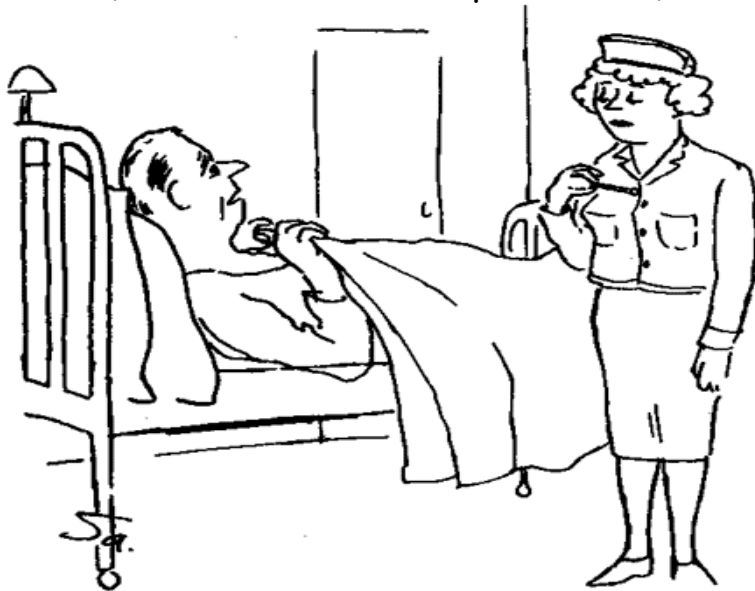
