Editorial: On Living the A. A. Way for 7 Years

Funny thing after all these years. . .but it seems I haven't known too much about A.A. and what it *really* meant until just lately. And I suppose I shall go on as long as I live, and remain in A.A., feeling from week to week, month to month, and maybe even year to year, that I am only just beginning to have someappreciation of what it all means, how big it is.

Sure, for over seven years now I've yapped happily about A.A.--what it is, how to use it, and what it could do for you--when, in reality, I had only a glimmer of its full power. But now I've seen people use it. There was the A.A. couple who lost three children in one week. Another couple whose only son died. Then there was the fellow who sobered up a couple of years ago and was finally able to get his wife the fur coat he had been promising for ten years. . .she was killed wearing it within a

After 2 Years in A. A.

Two years in A.A. finds me increasingly happy and, I hope, a more useful citizen. It seems now that results come almost in direct ratio to my application of what A.A. offers for the taking. After more than thirty years of egotistical, selfish, and too often asocial behavior, I have slowly and laboriously acquired, through A.A. text and precept, a usable quota of humility.

This has proved to be the key to undeserved cooperation from many of my fellowmen and, of even more importance to me, to a reawakened faith in God. The spiritual and emotional lift received from the members who welcomed me at my first meeting in Forest Hills has increased steadily. Along with this have come new friends and a better understanding of how to use their experience.

The 24-hour plan made sense to me and proved to be the crutch I needed. That I have had no serious urge to drink since grasping its significance, seems to many, myself included, a minor miracle. Losing several good jobs, going to jail, being estranged from family and friends; finding myself flat broke and homeless after seeking medical and psychiatric help; making blind, desperate (but proud) appeals to the church--none of these had helped me to even face, let alone solve, my problem. Many

"THE BURNING OF GUILT"

The Fifth Step Promise: "The feeling that the drink problem has disappeared will often come on strongly," excited me greatly because I had unsuccessfully stopped drinking forever more times than I could count. With twenty years of periodic drunkenness behind me, I came into AA believing I was a goner for sure!

Even at six months sober I had a hard time believing that the AA miracle could really happen for me. The alcoholic obsession roared resiliently every day; at one point I wondered into a bar and almost ordered a gin & tonic — thank God I didn't! Nevertheless, this experience left me increasingly terrified and more doubtful than ever. Yet, I maintained my meager faith and was anxious to get on with the Twelve Step process. Then, God positioned Carl, a thirteen-year sober sponsor, in my path who directed me through Steps Four, Five, Six and Seven on a fortunate Hollywood afternoon.

During the Fifth Step, Carl, pointed out the sordid details of where I had been selfish, dishonest, resentful and full of fear. Shortly thereafter, I asked God to remove my shortcomings and defects with the Seventh Step Prayer.

But I still felt distressingly guilty! Someone said, "You feel guilty, because you are guilty!" But then a surprise! Carl tore up all my written paperwork, except the Eight Step list, placed it into an old charred bowl in the sink, turned on the fan above; then set the entire works on fire!

Carl then lamented: "There goes your past up in smoke! You need not feel guilty about all those mistakes of your drinking days, because each morning that you wake up, you become a brand new person that you have never been before. You are now on God's train! (He

pointed upward) You are no longer associating with your old drinking friends on the Death & Destruction Express, (He pointed downward) but if you take just one shot of whisky, you get all your guilt back!"

As the months passed the seemingly impossible Fifth Step Promise *did* come true; that *hole-in-the-stomach* guilt began to diminish... consequently, thanks to God, I haven't had to drink since my first AA meeting!

I believe that my husband has been a sick man and that he is apt to have a relapse at any time unless his "allergy" is kept in check.

I believe that my husband and I need help from a supreme power in conquering this affliction, and I will not forget to give thanks daily for the help we receive in keeping our feet on the path to this new way of life.

I believe that, except for this new power he has gained, my husband is still the very human man I married and I will not expect him to do a complete about-face of character and personality, giving up all the little minor faults that sometimes annoy me. I will constantly strive to keep my mind on the big fault he is conquering and remember the slogan: First things first.

I believe, however, that he will continue to gain in the acquisition of the positive qualities that make a pleasing personality: confidence, initiative, generosity, tolerance, etc., and I must never let my acceptance of this fact become humdrum and commonplace, but offer frequent encouragement, stimulation and appreciation to arm him for his daily battle.

I believe, in the light of my newly acquired knowledge, that his affliction is a disease and not simply lack of will power; that I, too, have never been on any pedestal of righteousness (although I admit I have sometimes thought so and acted accordingly).

I also believe that now more than ever I must maintain constant vigil over my habits and interests, taking a personal inventory daily to see where I can improve in order to keep pace with the growth my husband will experience, so that we may be truly partners in this great adventure.

I believe I must thoroughly know and understand all that A.A. stands for; that I must keep abreast with the progress of our own group by reading The Book, The Grapevine and other periodicals, as well as the notices on the bulletin board; by attending meetings, aiding in furnishing refreshments, by warmly accepting and welcoming new members, especially by helping the wives and female members to feel at home in the movement and by taking part in the program whenever called on.

I believe that our membership in A.A. is the best thing that ever happened to us. Accordingly, I will not forget to give thanks daily. I will be an active member in every way and I will try to share this joy with others by enlisting their membership and helping them to understand the principles of A.A.

week.

All of them stayed sober and I thought that was fine. They even continued to be thankful for their years of sobriety, for the way A.A. had helped them meet their problems. They made me feel ashamed because I didn't know how I would have reacted had these things happened to me. Then came my nephew's fatal accident and I don't think that anyone who knew my brother and me--both A.A.s--gave the possibility of our drinking a thought. I know at least that we didn't. And I also know that both of us had been dry long enough so that we had the boy's respect, and we are thankful for that. My brother says, "J. is where we put him when he went

into the Army--in God's hands--and he's still in that care." My brother and his wife are *living* that way, and it is a great and merciful thing that we can feel as we do about it.

I don't mean we just say that, and then go out and play golf--we have that very human selfishness that creeps up often, of wanting him back, of feeling resentful that he was taken; but when that happens we can straighten ourselves out. We live by A.A.

("Two Years" Continued from page 1) helping hands were offered but I could not take them.

The answer was found in A.A.'s way of living: first by acknowledging my inability to work out my own problems, then humbly seeking the help of God to learn His will; avoiding resentments and intolerance; trying each day to grow in understanding and work; staying away from drink and, to me equally important, staying away from the kind of thinking that precedes drinking; being willing to share my imperfect understanding with someone it might help; and gradually through these efforts acquiring the serene knowledge that good comes when selfishness, arrogance, and intolerance are cleared away.

Problems are not automatically eliminated; rather I find it pleasant to work

them out, confident that right (not necessarily my own brand) will follow. A.A. has taught me how to live with myself without seeking relief from the mess by drinking. How did it happen? I was licked, scared, hopeless. All my defenses had been breached. A.A. made sense. Being an extremist, I took it in large doses: many meetings, all the luncheons I could make, hours of discussion with patient, sympathetic A.A.s. God bless them all.
