"One thing's for sure, it will keep you sober." These were the first words out of my sponsor's mouth when I called to tell him that my home group wanted me to be the GSR. Then he said, "Study the Traditions, and we'll talk." It's hard to believe that this conversation took place just a little over a year ago.

My sponsor, as usual, was absolutely right. In the past year I've developed a strong love for the Steps, Traditions, and the Concepts. For me, the Fellowship is my lifeline. It's very important for me to tell how doing service work has affected my sober life.

In the past year there has been an overabundance of "events" in my personal life. This is where the service work has really paid off for me. Thanks to the group, I have a wonderful opportunity to get out of myself. I've learned what self-sacrifice is all about.

I've also learned that I need always keep an open mind, accompanied with

February 28, 1994 was a really enjoyable day. Bright sunshine and relatively mild temperatures were a welcome change of pace from a winter that was living up to its reputation for the first time in years. However, the true high point of that day arrived after dark, as it has for me on every Monday since I crash-landed in the rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous on April 23, 1989. That's when my home group--the Hampton Bays Easy Does It Group--meets. On February 28, a roomful of people joined us in celebrating our ninth group anniversary, and the relaxed and joyful atmosphere served to remind me how fortunate I am to have such a place to serve as an anchor for my sobriety.

My group is where I learned how AA worked, and relearned what it meant to be a responsible person and a friend. At eight months sober, I "mistakenly" stayed for a business meeting and, much to my horror, got voted in for a two-year term as treasurer. In retrospect, it was the best thing that could have happened to me. I had to show up every Monday night, plus give a report and answer

be able to do this, there has to be ac-
ceptance--acceptance to allow situa-
tions and people to be exactly what
they are at any moment in time.

There are now aspects of service work
I'm no longer physically capable of
doing but God has opened new doors
for me. Previously, whenever anyone
called needing a ride to a meeting or
other assistance, I was there. Today,
God is allowing this privilege to oth-
ers so that I can get to meetings.

Today I answer the hotline, I'm still
the GSR, and I chair one meeting a
week. I try to do anything I can to help
others. I'm not saying this to boast or
brag, just to let you know that it's the
service work that keeps me going.
When I begin to feel useless, I'm
quickly reminded that when anyone

calls me, I am there.

There's a whole world out there. It
doesn't end at the group level. With
each new opportunity comes another
form of growth and blessings. I'm for-
ever grateful for being given the op-
portunity to meet new and interesting
people from outside my own little
world. I'm able to enjoy a richer life
by doing what I can to help someone
else along the path.

Service work really does keep me so-
ber and adds to my quality of life. You
know the phrase "Contempt prior to
investigation." In other words, don't
knock it until you've tried it!

Hang tough, get active, and may God
bless you on your journey.

questions at each business meeting. In a typically panic-stricken maneuver to learn every single thing about my new position, I started grilling the treasurers of nearby groups and gave myself eye-strain ripping through any book, pamphlet, or article I could find dealing with the Twelve Traditions and AA history. Most importantly, I became friends with the seven people who comprised the group at that time. In the same manner as my sponsors, those men and women took gentle, yet unshakable, hold of me and became my guides through the unfamiliar terrain of sobriety.

It's been over four years since my group first entrusted me with the responsibility of service, and many aspects of my life have changed for the

better. The changes were often painful and frightening, but there was never a time when I couldn't draw upon the collective experience, strength, and hope of my home group. My group became a constant in my nascent sober lifestyle, and an invaluable source of stability. For one hour each week, I knew exactly what was expected of me, and what I'd receive in return—a warm welcome from my AA family, who always made me feel special and valuable.

I'll finish this brief account with a quote from William Butler Yeats:

"Think where man's glory most begins and ends. And say my glory was I had such friends."

Easy to Forget

On a recent morning after our Attitude Adjustment Meeting, a friend shared that he'd been trying to help a distant newcomer by telephone. Although she'd attended meetings in her small community, she'd been turned off by the cliquishness she'd encountered. He asked my advice.

I thought back to a women's afternoon meeting I'd attended as a newcomer. At the break, the women had gathered in clusters of two or three, and I sat alone, feeling so conspicuous and uncomfortable that after a few minutes, I got up and left.

Fortunately there are so many meetings to choose from in my neighborhood that I found a meeting whose members extended a friendly hand and made me feel welcome. I remember one gentleman who sat by the door and greeted each person as he or she entered. He had a warm smile and always found something to say to each of us. His example has continued to be an inspiration to me in my continued sobriety.

It's so easy to forget how frightened and alone we felt at our first AA meetings. We become comfortable and friendly with people we know, and sometimes we may forget to extend the spirit of friendliness to the newcomer.

As I see it, this is a golden opportunity to work the Twelfth Step. Our smiles, our handshakes, our invitations to come along for coffee after

meetings are important ingredients that make the AA Fellowship a program of attraction.

If I feel lonely or sad, for any reason, and my sponsor isn't available, I can usually find a meeting nearby. I try to remember the friendly greeter who gave me the encouragement I needed as a newcomer and extend the same spirit of friendship to both new and familiar faces. Although I may want to sit with friends, I often sit near someone who appears to be alone and introduce myself. By the end of the meeting my sadness usually dwindles or disappears.

Likewise, when we hear a fellow member share a painful experience during the meeting, it is vital that we share our understanding. Recently a sober friend shared in a meeting that one of her sponsees had committed suicide. She said that afterwards, as she was boxing up the literature, not one member of the group came up to acknowledge her sorrow.

While sobriety in AA brings the joys of fellowship, we must always keep in mind that our primary purpose is to stay sober and help others to maintain their sobriety. Reaching out beyond our immediate circle of friends to the newcomer or to the old-timer who needs encouragement is an integral part of this purpose. I'm grateful for every member of Alcoholics Anonymous who has taken the time to extend a friendly hand to me.

STOPPING THE PAIN Feeling accepted helps her start to live

WHEN I first came into AA I wanted to die. I hated life and everyone around me, and was sure that you hated me too. I wanted the pain to stop, but I no longer could remember what I did before I started drinking or drugging. I didn't know how to live life with or without alcohol.

I heard a lady share at a meeting about how empty she was, and I could relate. She cried, and everyone comforted her and even seemed to share her pain.

That really had an impact on me. I could see that these people were real. I wasn't used to that. I kept coming back and eventually let them get to know me, too. They didn't run away; they didn't tell me I was junk. My whole attitude and outlook on life has changed. I was sure that I wouldn't live past the age of 18. I was two years sober on my 18th birthday. I just turned 39 and I'm still happy and sober. They told me that it just gets better and . . . guess what? It does.

They Stopped in Time

Among today's incoming AA members, many have never reached the advanced stages of alcoholism, though given time all might have.

Most of these fortunate ones have had little or no acquaintance with delirium, with hospitals, asylums, and jails. Some were drinking heavily, and there had been occasional episodes. But with many, drinking had been little more than a sometimes uncontrollable

nuisance. Seldom had any of these lost either health, business, family, or friends.

Why do men and women like these join AA? . . . They sum it up something like this: "We didn't wait to hit bottom because, thank God, we could see the bottom. Actually, the bottom came up and hit us. That sold us on Alcoholics Anonymous."
