KNOWLEDGE FOR THE TAKING

THERE is an old Chinese proverb to the effect that "Knowledge is obtained from others. . .Wisdom we must acquire ourselves."

How perfectly this applies to the AA program. Simply for the taking, we have the knowledge, based on the experiences of the first 100 members of AA. They set down in the Twelve Steps, the mechanics of the operation of rehabilitation, as they did it, and saved us the wear and tear of formulating a procedure. We know that it worked for them, so we know that it will work for us. Their knowledge and the ramifications of it, as obtained through the daily and weekly power of association in AA, gives us a positive and workable procedure.

However, if we do not have or do not acquire the wisdom to apply this knowledge, then we will have fallen far short of our objective. If we are wise to the point of realizing that the First Step is but a "stepping stone" to a new way of life and that sobriety is only the beginning, then that wisdom will allow the other eleven Steps to seep into our way of living and give the security that makes possible, freedom from fear and anxiety.

Faith Is the knowledge of belief

I KNOW that we who have achieved through AA the sobriety we sought but could not find alone, have felt that nothing less than a miracle had happened to us.

We felt ourselves a thing apart, doomed to the half-alive gutter-existence of the drunkard. For we were in an emotional gutter, and don't think for a moment we liked it.

We had long since ceased to drink for pleasure. We had even ceased to drink as a career. We drank in self-defense because we could not help ourselves. We lived in our own dark little world of remorse, fantasy, misery and fear.

True, we found a new way of life in AA. Indeed, it was as if we were born again. In this respect, perhaps it was a miracle. We had lost our families, our friends and our livelihood through alcohol; through AA, they were miraculously returned to us.

A miracle? AA a miracle?

Perhaps, but maybe "miracle" isn't just the word.

You see, our families' love and our friends' regard had not turned to hate. They had only hated the things we did. Once this AA 'way of life' opened up the glorious future to us, their love and their respect returned a hundred-fold.

Nothing was changed, but ourselves. And we had only changed a little bit. We had merely found room in our hearts for others, for a few of our fellow men as sorely in need of understanding friendship as ourselves. And we had found a little corner, with room to grow, for God.

We had found a little faith.

A miracle, to quote the dictionary loosely, is something which can't happen, but does. . . once. . . and is not likely to happen again. This takes what happened to us right out of the miracle class. It 'couldn't happen'. . . but it did. Not once, but 120,000 times. And it continues to happen every day.

Admitting God into the house of our soul is not a miracle. Actually, God was with us all the time.

We merely found Him there.



Sunday afternoon, December 21, 1947. . .sitting before a window high up in the Book-Cadillac Hotel in Detroit. . .the end of six days during which I hardly knew night from day. . .only a few brief moments of freedom from blackout. . .and those moments torture.

Get the window up, the room's high enough. One quick plunge will do it. There's nothing else left, no other way out, no hope, no use making another try. This is it. . .end of the whole nightmare. At least I won't have to wake up once more and wonder how soon the bar opens. A few more drinks and I'll have the nerve. . .a running plunge headfirst at the window. A side alley down there. . .good. . .no mess on the main street.

Sorry for my wife and the kids, but it's better this way. They could not stand anymore of this. . .they shouldn't have to.

"The effectual, fervent prayer of righteous man availeth much..."
Yesterday afternoon, wasn't it, that maid came in to clean up the room? What was it she said? Oh, yes...why didn't I stop drinking like this. I said I couldn't. She wanted to know why I didn't ask the good Lord to help me? I said I guessed He must be fed up with me; you ask Him for me. "Mister, I'll do that when I get home."

"Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death. . ."

Well, let's get on with it. Finish these drinks first. No use thinking any more; that's all over. No more "angles" on new ways to stop. I've tried 'em all. I'm licked, finished. The hell of it is, I love my wife. Sounds crazy, but it's true. Must love me, or she'd never have stuck this far, still hoping I'd come out of this. I promised her this trip would be different. . . then I took that cocktail just to bolster my ego. Always it was just going to be a couple. . . and always it was the same. This time. . . Monday noon to Sunday afternoon. . . blank. Except for the moment I talked with that maid yesterday. She was the only one who wanted to talk with me this week.

"Underneath are the everlasting arms. . . "

Couple years ago my wife asked me to look into this Alcoholics Anonymous thing. Funny I should think of it now. I remember I'd brushed it off, said it was for drunks, some sort of hallelujah outfit. . .not for me. I wasn't a drunk not me. Well, I sure am now. Hell, maybe those AA guys have something; I wouldn't know. But if they are sober, it doesn't make much difference what system they use. My "system" brought me. . .well, right here in front of this window, journey's end.


Wonder how those fellows do it? Not for me, of course...nothing will help me now...but...I wonder if this AA outfit is here in Detroit? Sure...there it is...there is the number... Just for the hell of it, I'll give 'em a ring. Somebody to talk to, anyway.

"Look, fella, will you promise to stay in that room for half an hour? I'm sending somebody to see you. . . Sure it's a bad day, but they'll be there. . . You just stay put. . .never mind the shape you are in, these two are alcoholic Phi Beta Kappas. . ."

I wonder if that chambermaid will ever know what her prayer may have done? Probably she doesn't. But God knows and I know. And I know now that my prayer for another, like hers, will be heard, and that there is a way out of that valley into the morning light of a new day.




