FIFTH STEP PROVIDES RELEASE

Revealing my innermost secrets via the Fifth Step would have been terrifiying in anticipation had my sponsor, Carl, gave me time for consideration. But thank God he followed the Big Book clear-cut directions on page 74 telling to start Step Five, "at the first opportunity." This turned to

be, surprisingly, about five minutes after finishing up Step Four with him. This left **no time** to decide which of my seemingly unforgivable past activities to keep to myself. This suddeness left no time for irrational fear to cloud my ensuing admission of the exact

nature of my many glaring defects.

Left off guard, so to speak, I had only to rely on my written Fourth Step information which was right in front of me; it couldn't be ignored or changed. In Step Five, my sponsor focused the light of truth onto the unrealized driving forces of selfishness, dishonesty, resentment and fear. Step Four had provided tools for me to 'face and be rid of' these grosser handicaps . . . but ("Release" Continued on page 9)

The smell of freedom

STEP FIVE: Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.

I did my Fifth Step today. After I was done, it was recommended that I spend some quiet time alone reflecting on what I had just done, then proceed on with Steps Six and Seven if I felt ready.

When I got home, I went outside to my special place among some trees

that I'm particularly fond of. There is a little bistro set where I can sit and meditate and enjoy the outdoors. It is my place of serenity.

I sat in the dark and talked to the God of my understanding. I admitted my wrongs and asked

God for forgiveness. I thought about my character defects, especially the ones that I use to comfort myself. I realized that safe in God's love, under his protection and care, I didn't need them anymore. I searched my heart for refusal to let go. I found none. I told God I didn't know how to live a life without my defects but I was willing to lay them down, willing to have them removed, and I asked him to remove (*"Freedom" Continued on page 10*)








still, countless other destructive little demons, of the grosser variety, lurked in some dark dank space deep inside my subconscious mind just raring to take over, per usual. When the listed "Harms to others" and "sexual conduct" items were exposed, he had me include them on my Eighth Step as they were being discussed.

We discussed and utilized the Step Four tools to *face and be rid of* the repeated emotions of anger (resentments) that had been plaguing me for years (p. 67). We also prayed for God to show me what I should do in each of these specific matters (p. 69). Where previously, I had found only a *temporary relief*, I have now found a tool that provides a permanent *release* from these deadly ingredients of mental obsession. cussed and brought into my immediate awareness—this allowed me freedom to act on them as they would continue to arise throughout the rest of my life. I then learned that all these tools were to be used over and again as I began living in the spirit of Step Ten; that these newly learned were to become a major ingredient in my forthcoming growth and Maintenance Steps, Ten, Eleven and Twelve. We learn tools in Steps Four through Nine—we use them in Step Ten!

In Step Three I asked God to relive me of the bondage of self, although I didn't know what that was, but then I knew! This short Step Five period with my sponsor has allowed me a *permanent release*—not just *temporary relief*—from my that obsession to get "*boiled as an owl*" (p. 191).

What a blessing! Also, where I had been selfish and dishonest were dis-

them.

Some people burn their Fourth Step inventories at this point. I wasn't ready to burn mine. I figured I might need it some day.

But there was a particular event in my life that I wrote about in a book separate from the one I used for my Step work. This event was not something that was my fault. It was something that left me with a lot of pain and confusion and questions that could never be answered. When I had strong feelings about it, I would go back and write about them in this book. It was my secret book. I read a section from it when I did my Fifth Step.

As I thought about it, I realized I was ready to let this event go. I didn't need the answers anymore. I could not know the truth. God knew and that was enough. So I decided to burn the book.

As it burned, I gave it to God and I was free from the hold it had over me. I thought about the rest of my written work. I was ready to let my resentments go. I decided to burn that portion of my inventory. As it burned, I thought about my part in the situations. I had done wrong. But wrong also had been done to me. It is difficult to explain, but whatever I owed, whatever was owed to me, I gave over to God. God is the keeper of the balance now, not me.

And then I thought about my list of fears. I doubt I will ever be free of fear, but I knew I was ready to stop living with its constant presence. I was ready to stop letting it rule my life, ready to let faith in God replace fear. I put those fears in the fire and gave them to God. Next...relationships. By this time, I knew God had already forgiven me for the wrongs recorded on those pages. It was time to forgive myself and move forward. I set it on fire and gave it to God.

Next was my asset list. That had been the hardest part of my inventory. It had taken me over a year to see and believe that I had any assets at all. I could not burn that. Again, I might need it.

And then...the summary pages. This included a written list of my character defects. At first I thought I should hold on to this too. I might need to refer back to it. But then I realized I didn't need a written list of what's wrong with me. I want to focus on what's right with me—the positive, not the negative. God knows what's wrong with me and where I need to work. I set it on fire and gave it to God.

All the while I was burning the pages, I was talking to God, telling him all the things I was giving to him. As I watched the flames of the fire die down and fade away, there was a peace in my soul like I have never known before.

In the quiet, a thought came to me from somewhere else: Would you give all your bad to God and not give your good?

I saw the list of my assets lying there on the ground where I had set it aside. I picked up the list and looked at it once more. I knew that this part of me belonged to God as well. I set it on fire and I gave it to God.

Release from Fear

The Fifth Step was a giant step in her progress, taking her farther than she realized

I APPROACHED the Fifth Step reluctantly. It was like swallowing a bitter pill. I knew that it had to be done, that it was best for me. But I didn't know why.

My choice of another person with whom to take the Step would be quite different now, because I feel that I have become a better judge of maturity and mental sobriety. But the person I chose at that time was a dear friend, at least on a superficial level, and we seemed to have much in common. It is true that she made it quite easy for me.

Afterwards, I still didn't know why I had taken the Step. But I had *done* it! I felt terrific relief, knowing that it was behind me and that it was one Step I could say had been taken. It was finished, I thought.

Then the woman with whom I had taken the Fifth Step seemed to have a relapse. While she didn't drink, she became quite erratic and frantic. All I could see, not having much maturity, was that she was not as pleasant and nice as she had been. One day she threatened me, in a veiled way, with the knowledge she had acquired when I took the Fifth Step with her. I could hardly believe it. My husband was present at the time, and all I had to do was glance at him to know that the threat wasn't in my imagination.

My first reaction was disbelief. Then a great sorrow and compassion flowed through me, that a human being could be so desperate for reassurance.

Only later did it occur to me that there was absolutely no fear within me because of what she knew about me or might possibly reveal. The mere fact of having taken the Step had washed away the hidden fear and the secret, exaggerated guilts I had lived with. I realized that simply by taking the Fifth Step my inability to see anything outside myself had been removed. I now was able to think in terms of another person.

Then I started to understand what this Step means: release from fear, in order that we may *begin*. For until this release from fear is effected we can't possibly find the freedom that is vital for progress in our new way of life. The Fifth Step isn't, after all, an ending. It is the beginning--of truth, of reality, of living in the present, rather than in the nightmarish past or frightening future.
