### **BUILD STEP BY STEP**

To many of us spend a lot of time thinking one thing and expecting to become something else. Conditions of being are not attained by thinking of their opposites: Health is not gained by studying and thinking about disease; nor is happiness attained by dwelling on the sorrows and misery rampant in the world. We are not so constituted that we can devote our time and thought to one thing and become something entirely different

Most of us completed our courses under the tutelage of John Barleycorn - even the extra-curricular activities.

To master our course in sobriety we have to *think* and *live* sobriety to the exclusion of those things we learned with old J.B.

We are only showing the processes of our own recovery when we spend too much time thinking of our drinking careers; even at its best such contemplation is not good.

Each of us, in our own way, is attempting to build something better and finer than we've known before. All right then, we should have a blueprint for our sobriety.

## Reborn

The Big Book amazingly promises that we will be reborn (p. 63). In Big Book context, Bill W may have been referring to Dr. Carl Jung's description of a spiritual experience: "Ideas, emotions, and attitudes, which were once the guiding forces of the lives of these men are suddenly cast to one side and replaced by a completely net set of conceptions and motives . . . " (p. 27) Of course, Bill himself had a near similar experience at Towns Hospital (p. 14).

I had a similar experience when I was about three months sober but had not yet worked the steps. One late night while meditating on a pier of rocks protruding into the Ocean in Santa Monica, California, I was overcome with a tremendous surge of energy and joy that sent me sprinting down the beach. This lasted a long time but had dissipated by the next morning. It occurred to me that I had experienced the same as Bill Wilson on page 14—perhaps, I too had become "reborn!"

But alas, two months later I marched into a bar and almost ordered a gin and tonic. Thank God I didn't, but I certainly had not had the Big Book definition of a spiritual experience: "A personality change sufficient to bring about recovery from alcoholism." (p. 567).

But as time passes, I realize that God has removed the mental obsession to drink alcohol so long as I remain in a fit spiritual condition. Indeed, the 10<sup>th</sup> step promise on page 85 has happened: "*The problem* (mental obsession) *has been removed. It does not exist for us.*" In this context, I have been reborn!

If we were going to build a temple, we certainly wouldn't study the plans for a tavern - they are opposites in purpose and design.

In the 12 Steps of A.A. we are given the best tools in the world with which to build our structure of sobriety - but what good are those tools going to do us if we don't study the right plans?

The first and most important thing for us to plan is our foundation - this is going to "have to be good"; it will have to be strong enough to support our edifice against all stress, strain and the buffetings of the winds of Fate.

Here are some of the materials we are going to need in our foundation: First we'll need a large portion of humility - true humility, not the door-mat variety. Another good word for humility (in case you don't care for the word) is teachability - the absence of self-will and egotism.

Another thing we'll need in goodly amount is gratitude; gratitude to that Power Greater than ourselves - because only with the help of that Power can we again become sane and useful people. And only as we make the most of ourselves can we truly make amends to others.

Tolerance is another material we must have, great heaps of it, because it makes these other things blend well.

Now we'll mix the foregoing materials well and to them we'll add the strongest cement in the world - love.

These are the elements of a most solid and enduring foundation,

on which we are safe in erecting our house of sobriety. OK, so we know what we are going to put into our foundation. The next question is, "how big is it going to be?" That we answer for ourselves by deciding what we need room for in our lives. If we are going to practice the principles set down in A.A. (in all our affairs) we are going to need a lot of room in which to grow.

We have our foundation, let's see what materials we have at hand for our structure. Let us be very sure that none of our materials are faulty; the bricks with which we build our house must be as perfect as we can make them. If we allow our bricks to become shot thru' with the straws and rubble of self-pity, resentment, fear, narrow-mindedness, egotism and reservations of one sort and another we are going to find that our whole structure suffers as the result of the inferior materials.

We are all familiar with the ingredients necessary for bricks of lasting value - such as: faith, courage, determination, kindness, understanding, generosity, sincerity, friendliness, self-respect and true compassion. These are but a few, but we can know that if we use plenty of these, our structure will have endurance and beauty.

Keeping our blueprint in mind, we'll put each brick in its proper place and then almost before we know it, our house of sobriety will become a reality - a reality which will show how closely we've followed our own particular blueprint.

The monetary amount of each contribution is secondary to the spiritual connection that joins us in unity with A.A. groups around the world.





# Spiritual Experiences by Bill W.

It is the intention of the Grapevine to carry occasional apparent to nearly everyone else present that he has accounts of spiritual experiences. To this interesting project I would like to say a few introductory words. There is a very natural tendency to set apart those experiences or awakenings which happen to be sudden, spectacular or vision producing. Therefore any recital of such cases always produces mixed reactions. Some will say, "I wish I could have an experience like that!" Others, feeling that this whole business is too far out on the mystic limb for them, or maybe hallucinatory after all, will has found faith in God. say, "I just can't buy this business. I can't understand what these people are talking about."

As most AA's have heard, I was the recipient in 1934 of a tremendous mystic experience or "illumination." It was accompanied by a sense of intense white light, by a sudden gift of faith in the goodness of Cod, and by a profound conviction of His presence. At first it was very natural for me to feel that this experience staked me out for somebody very special.

But as I now look back upon this tremendous event, I can only feel very specially grateful. It now seems clear that the only special feature of my experience was its electric suddenness and the overwhelming and immediate conviction that it carried to me.

In all other respects, however, I am sure that my own experience was not in the least different than that received by every AA member who has strenuously practiced our recovery program.

How often do we sit in AA meetings and hear the speaker declare, "But I haven't yet got the spiritual angle." Prior to this statement, he had described a miracle of transformation which had occurred in him not only his release from alcohol, but a complete change in his whole attitude toward life and the living of it. It is

received a great gift; and that this gift was all out of proportion to anything that might be expected from simple AA activity, such as the admission of alcoholism and the practice of Step Twelve. So we in the audience smile and say to ourselves, "Well, that guy is just reeking with the spiritual angle-except that he doesn't seem to know it yet!" We well know that this questioning individual will tell us six months or a year hence that he

Moreover he may by then be displaying "spiritual qualities" and a performance that I myself have never been able to duplicate - my sudden spiritual experience notwithstanding.

So nowadays when AA's come to me, hoping to find out how one comes by those sudden experiences, I simply tell them in all probability that they have had one just as good - and that theirs is identical excepting it has been strung out over a longer period of time.

Then I go on to say that if their transformation in AA extending over six months had been condensed into six minutes - well, they then might have seen the stars too!

In consequence of these observations I fail to see any great difference between the sudden experiences and the more gradual ones - they are certainly all of the same piece. And there is one sure test of them all: "By their fruits, ye shall know them."

This is why I think we should question no one's transformation - whether it be sudden or gradual. Nor should we demand anyone's special type for ourselves, because our own experience suggests that we are apt to receive whatever may be the most useful for our needs.
